A PROCLAMATION WILDLIFE AWARENESS WEEK

- WHEREAS: Wildlife observation is a popular outdoor recreational activity in Georgia for citizens and visitors alike; and
- WHEREAS: Georgia's wildlife population is an integral part of the state's natural environment, as it also serves as an indicator for the overall health of Georgia's statewide ecosystems; and
- WHEREAS: Each year in the U.S., more than 200 people are killed in wildlife-vehicle collisions, 26,000 are injured, and more than 1.5 million animals are hit on roads. The average cost of property damage from these collisions is over \$1 billion, and the total cost to our country is more than \$8 billion a year; and
- WHEREAS: The success of wildlife movement and survival in Georgia remains dependent upon continued public education and increased understanding of the essential role migration corridors play in wildlife movement; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 19-23, 2011, as WILDLIFE AWARENESS WEEK in Georgia and encourage my fellow Georgians to educate themselves about local wildlife and their interaction with ecosystems.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 20th day of July in the year of our Lord two thousand eleven.
